Welcome back everyone!

Today we are learning more about another of Jesus's parables, the parable of the mustard seed.



## **The Parable of the Mustard Seed**

Seeds are usually quite small and may look like they will never be very important. However, although they are tiny they are just the beginning of something and can grow into something huge!

It can be that way with us. Sometimes people can feel that they are not important to God, that they are too small and the things that they are able to do are not important either. They think that what they can do doesn't make a difference or that no-one notices.

Some people in Jesus's time thought the same too.  
Jesus wanted to help them so he told them the story  
of the mustard seed.

The story that Jesus told can be found in the Bible,  
in the New Testament Matthew 13 31-32.

A mustard seed is very small.

**31** He told them another parable: "The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed,  
which a man took and planted in his field. **32** Though it is the smallest of all seeds, yet  
when it grows, it is the largest of garden plants and becomes a tree, so that the birds  
come and perch in its branches."



But when it is planted in the ground it grows into a  
big tree.

So Jesus told the story of how a man planted a tiny mustard seed and it grew and grew into a big tree that birds visited to sit on the branches. Jesus said that the kingdom of God is like the mustard seed. Things might look very small at the beginning but someday they can be very, very big!

### Jesus's Message

1. A huge plant grows from a tiny seed. God's kingdom grew from small beginnings too. God sent us his son, Jesus to show us the way. He chose 12 special friends to help him and from these small beginnings the Christian church grew and grew. Today there are about 2.4 billion Christians in the world! How amazing is that! Thanks be to God.
2. We are a part of God's kingdom and we all have a part to play. It doesn't matter if we feel that our gifts are small, God takes them and uses them to grow the kingdom. It doesn't matter if we are very young or very old. God values everyone. We just have to keep on doing the right thing and God will make them grow. This video explains it a little more

3. Jesus said that even if our faith is as small as a mustard seed, God will use it to do great and wonderful things!
